Epiphany - Lent - February - 2005

Lent - Already?

Lent is very early this year ... and the way things are going this winter, it may be much like 1994, when we wrote "Happy Easter" in three feet of snow with the left over egg dye.

Determining when Easter occurs is an interesting Lenten factoid ... you'll find tables in the Book of Common Prayer beginning on page 880, with references to the golden number and other esoteric things. However, the rule is that Easter is always the first Sunday after the full moon that falls on or after March 21; it cannot occur before March 22 or after April 25. This year it's March 27. And then, one doesn't just count back 40 days to determine Ash Wednesday, because Sundays are always celebrations of the resurrection and so do not count (note that Sundays that occur during Lent are called Sundays IN Lent, not OF Lent). Take the Sundays out of the equation and we end up with Ash Wednesday this year on February 9.

We are pleased that this Ash Wednesday, Bishop Paul will be making his annual visitation to us at Trinity. Our service will begin at 7 p.m. We've said before that if the Episcopal Church had Holy Days of Obligation, Ash Wednesday would be one.

I remember having a conversation years ago with Bishop Paul about Lent. I told him I thought it was depressing and he seemed surprised. Here's an excerpt from his February column in *Episcopal Life*:

Let me be the first to say I like Lent.

I like slowing down the many distractions of life. I like focusing on important truth, reading and praying more while talking less. Seinfeld re-run junkie that I am, I look forward to annual un-plugging of the television and simplifications of diet that make room for Lenten work.

Lent never fails to bring me hard questions, some acutely painful, that tune my soul for Easter's shout of new reality.

Read the rest of it when your issue arrives. Bishop Paul, as always, says it beautifully.

We'll prepare for Lent by once again holding a Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on February 8 at 6.

We'll observe the beginning of Lent with on Ash Wednesday with Bishop Paul: Holy Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes at 7 p.m. If you need a ride, please call the church office.

During the Sundays in Lent our worship will be Holy Eucharist, Rite I, and we'll begin the first Sunday in Lent with the Great Litany.

This season is one of self-examination and denial, but it is also a wonderful opportunity for outreach. What can you do to help others? Who is lonely and would love a visit or phone call? Who needs help with basic necessities? Take the opportunity to be Jesus in the world.

You are invited to a holy and blessed Lent.




