Laying the Groundwork for a New Direction

"The goal of Groundwork is to encourage personal and congregational transformation, to ask congregational members and leaders to dig deeply into the soil of their mission and context to do serious and joyful learning about evangelism, invitation, and welcome"

During the Wednesdays in Lent a group has been meeting to begin to lay the foundation for what will eventually become our evangelism committee. Using the Groundwork program as a basis, they've studied the week's scripture readings with special emphasis on what we might learn about reaching out and sharing.

Another resource has been "All Doors Open," a practical look at what's reasonable and what's not in inviting people into the church ... and in helping them find a reason to stay.

This Fall the national church will debut an advertising campaign to coincide with back to school time. Our diocese has made a commitment to take part, and Trinity has joined in as well. While the ads are being produced nationally, they will air locally and people will begin looking at churches in their own neighborhoods.

Welcoming people into the church is something each one of us needs to do. "It has to be all of us and it's for our spiritual health, not for survival, not for paying the bills," says Trula Hollywood, who is coordinating the group sessions, "it is about being Jesus to the world."

"It's a big job, and we have a great deal of enthusiasm!" she adds.


