Pentecost - September - 2006

Vestry News

The vestry has begun the formal process of making Mother Trula our rector. They have issued a call to her and she has accepted. Then, when Bishop Paul sends a letter approving the call, the Archdeacon will review her ministry description. Then we can look forward to a Celebration of New Ministry.

Fr. Ned officially retires September 30; he is currently on sabbatical. He will remain very much a part of Trinity's life, serving as Assistant.

Our delegate to Diocesan Convention is John Schoonover; our alternate is Hermine Shapiro.

New lighting over the front door of the church and on the sign is being done; it will certainly make the church more visible.

Your rector and parish administrator tackled the Sacristy recently; it probably at least a ton lighter than it was (we couldn't fit any more in the car to haul away). That work will continue as we reorganize the library and files.

We are negotiating the replacement of the parish hall back door so that wind won't blow into the kitchen this winter and bugs will stop crawling in during the summer.

The rectory will undergo extensive work over the next year. The vestry approved replacing the ancient oil furnace several months ago. The gutters on the roof will be moved, which will stop the basement from flooding when it rains, and a new one placed on the front porch, which currently drips on the steps. Most of the interior walls are cracked or have water damage. Barbara will do the repair and painting inside.

Vestry meets the third Sunday of the month following coffee hour. Meetings are open and anyone is welcome to attend.

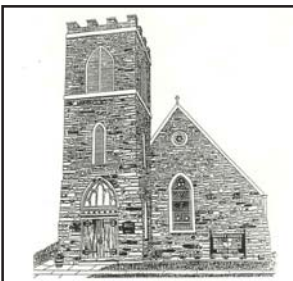
Rector's Discretionary Fund
