Lent - Easter - April - 2009

Greetings,

It is unbelievable to me how fast the month of March seemed to pass. Now here we are in April and approaching Holy Week.

When time goes by so fast, I become wary of whether I (we) are letting the experience of life pass us by because we have not allowed Christ to be the center of our lives.

I've been reading a book about the life of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. It contains a great many quotes and the one I that struck me today is, "None of us come into this world fully formed. We would not know how to think, or walk or speak or behave as human beings unless we learned it from other human beings. We need other human beings in order to be human. I am because other people are."

I recently spoke about how Jesus wasn't just a role model for us. Beyond the "what would Jesus do" question, is the fact that Jesus is everything, absolutely everything for us.

As Holy Week approaches we will experience the excruciating, painful journey Jesus took in his last days on earth. If we allow ourselves to "get personal" with the experience of Holy Week, we will feel the connection with this human being as the journey begins by entering Jerusalem on a donkey and ends with his glorious resurrection.

Holy Week reminds us that God gave us the most precious gift ever, life. From birth, alone, we cannot survive. Our parents, or someone who cares for us, brought us through infancy, childhood and those wonderful adolescent

years. Our family, friends, and acquaintances have all affected us in some way allowing us to grow into the person we are today. And these are the people who have journeyed with us through all the pain, trouble, grief, triumphs and joys of our lives.

We, in turn, have done the same for those whom we love and care about. And so, because of the journey that our Lord took for us, we journey on together.

We are born with no clarity in thought or sight but, as we grow, we become real. We learn how to act as social beings. We learn responsibility, how to love and how to trust. We learn all of these things from our experience with each other in community.

Our journey begins with that first breath we take after being taken from our mother's womb. We are given life and Jesus asks only that we truly experience it, growing into it as we would a jacket that is sizes too large.





Northern Tier Churches Evangelism Project begins this week: (more on page 4)


WNEP, an ABC affiliate out of Scranton, reaches almost all of the parishes in the northern and central part of the diocese. It also reaches as far south as Allentown and Bethlehem, but for market reasons it does not include that area. (That region belongs to the Philadelphia market.) During WNEP's daily newscasts the station reaches 82% of adults age 25-54 in the central and northern portion of the Diocese of Bethlehem. A yearlong television advertising campaign would be cost prohibitive for any single parish, but if we each contributed \$1,000 to \$1,500 we could participate in a campaign to promote the Episcopal Church in Northeastern Pennsylvania. Churches which cannot contribute that amount are asked to pledge an amount more attainable, because we anticipate that every parish will benefit from this cooperative venture. No single congregation will be highlighted during this campaign. It is also worth noting that no other denomination is advertising locally on any station. This is a one-year experiment.

Parish Newsbits


