Lent - March 2010

Greetings,

As we journey through Lent this year, many things come to my mind. Many of us are watching the Winter Olympics and hearing life stories of people who have lived through amazing ordeals and come back even stronger; athletes who have survived physical, emotional and social barriers only to rise to the occasion in this very special event.

Jesus goes into the wilderness for these days facing ordeals and struggles that help him to focus on his mission and future.

Today, we also watch as thousands of people continue to experience undeniable loss, pain and frustration in Haiti. People are living with the task of surviving every day with less than any of us could imagine. They must surely feel as if they have lost their reality and are wandering in the wilderness. Even as their world was shaken, for many their faith has *not* been shaken.

I watch the news at night and see stories of people who are struggling to keep their homes and to put food on the table as their livelihood disappears in front of their eyes.

And those who continue to fight in what seems like endless wars, leaving behind their families, their comforts and in some cases, giving their lives, so our comforts will not be lost are also in my thoughts as we move forward this Lenten season.

As we make our sacrifices during Lent, we need to be reminded of the wilderness in which others are wandering. If we think giving up sweets is difficult, it's obvious reminders are necessary.

We follow a path in our life that has many different courses to choose from; as well as some

courses we did not choose, but know as part of our genetic makeup.

I have recently had occasion to speak at length, with a transgendered individual, as well as some families of those who have gay loved ones. They told me stories of being turned away from churches here in our area. They told me stories of being "discarded" by those who previously professed to love them. They told me stories of being asked to leave restaurants because they were a distraction and there were "children present" in the establishment. It's as if going out in public in your own skin, not even the skin of a leper, but the skin of someone who is different is somehow X-rated. It's as if being oneself in public scares people so much they forget that God loves us all. Those comforts our young men and women have fought for become a nesting place allowing people to lie in their nest and look down on others. The individuals I spoke with described what I consider to be their "struggle in the wilderness" as they continue to work for something as simple as acceptance and equality.

The people of Haiti didn't suffer the earthquake because God was angry with them. Those who struggle and suffer at any point in their lives are not being punished. God didn't make us all different so that certain ones of us could be set aside as outcasts.

It amazes me how easy it is for some people to "sum" up the lives, tragedies, and experiences of others without ever meeting them.

Jesus faced our struggles and knows our pain. Jesus would never discard us.

I believe this with every ounce of my being.

Blessing Same-Sex Unions

The General Convention empowered bishops to make generous provisions regarding ministry to same sex couples and, in response, Bishop Paul has developed a pastoral provision for a rite of union. Our Vestry has agreed that we will support Mother Trula in moving forward with this provision. Couples must meet with the rector for pastoral care and counseling prior to a blessing of their union, as would those preparing for a traditional marriage. It should also be noted that this rite is the church's promise to help uphold a couple's commitment to each other and their relationship; it has no legal standing in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

us! Lunch provided, fun and fellowship and a voyage of discovery promised.

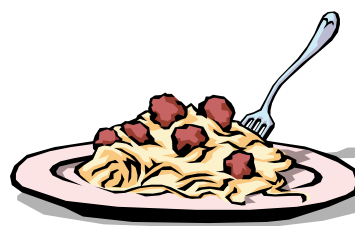


Children's Clothing

Altar Guild: You can help with our worship by learning to set up and take down the altar each weekend. Training is simple. Our altar guild members enjoy the quiet time preparing the church.

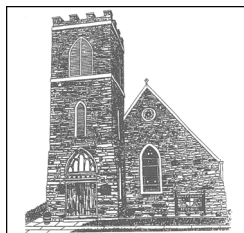
